#### **COVID SAFETY PROTOCOLS**

#### Through October 30, 2022

Proof of vaccination will not be required for audience members.

Masks are required for all guests, and must be worn at all times while visiting the theatre, except when eating or drinking in designated areas.

All masks must completely cover the nose and mouth and comply with the CDC guidelines for acceptable face coverings.

Guests who do not comply with these policies will be denied entry or asked to leave the theatre.

#### Location




The Samuel J. Friedman

The theatre is on the north side of the street between Broadway and 8th Avenue. It is closer to 8th Avenue than to Broadway.

The theatre is fully accessible to people with disabilities.


## **GETTING TO THE THEATRE:**

#### Walking from the Subway




49th Street N, R, and W trains

A D A -Accessible uptown only. Elevator on northeast corner of 49th Street and 7th Avenue.



50th Street C and E trains

A D A -Accessible downtown only. Elevator on north side of 49th Street between 8th and 9th Avenues.




42nd Street-Port Authority A, C, and E trains

A D A -Accessible. Elevator on southwest corner of 44th Street and 8th Avenue.



#### Walking from the Subway




50th Street 1 train

This station is not A D A - Accessible.



47-50 Streets-Rockefeller Center B, D, F, and M trains

A D A -Accessible. Elevator on northwest corner of 49th Street and 6th Avenue.



42nd Street-Times Square 1, 2, 3, 7, N, Q, R, W, and S

Elevator on northwest corner of 42nd Street and Broadway.


### Entering the building



Individuals who need to purchase or pick up their ticket from the box office should use the entrance on the left side of the exterior lobby.

Individuals who arrive to the theatre with their ticket should use the entrance on the right side of the exterior lobby.


Entering the building



All individuals entering the building with large purses, backpacks, tote bags, and other large items will be asked to open them for inspection by our security team.

## Picking up tickets



The box office is on the left side of the exterior lobby. You may pick up or purchase tickets at either window.

To the right of the box office is the house board. It lists any special information you need to know about the production including things like use of strobe lights, haze, loud noises, or smoking on stage.

#### Pre-Show at the Friedman



You are welcome to enter the interior lobby and our lounges 45 minutes prior to curtain.

There are three steps up to the interior lobby entrance.

In order to enter the interior lobby, please have your ticket out and ready to be scanned.

An elevator provides access to all interior levels without the need to use any steps. It is located on the right side of the exterior lobby. Patrons should ask the ticket taker to scan their ticket before entering the elevator.

### **Accessibility Devices**



You can check out free accessibility devices at the podium located immediately to your left when you enter the interior lobby. These include:

- Assistive Listening Devices
  - Hearing-aid Compatible Devices (T-Coil Loops)
- Closed Captioning (beginning 3 weeks after opening night)
- Audio Description (beginning 3 weeks after opening night)
  - Braille and Large Print Playbills

You'll need to leave a photo ID or credit card when checking out one of these devices.

# The Solomon Lounge on the Lower Level



There are 27 steps down from the interior lobby to the lower level's Solomon Lounge.

There is a bar in this lounge where you can purchase snacks, soft drinks, and alcoholic beverages.

The MTC Store is located adjacent to the bar.

There is a coat room which contains free storage lockers for jackets and oversized items.

#### Restrooms



Restrooms are located in the Solomon Lounge on the lower level behind the MTC history wall.

Restrooms are also located on either side of the Mezzanine level.

Gender diversity is welcome at Manhattan Theatre Club. Please use the restroom that best aligns with your personal gender identity or expression.

#### **Premier Circle**



There are 19 steps up from the interior lobby to the Premier Circle.

Members of Manhattan Theatre Club's Patron program have exclusive access to the Patrons' Lounge located on the Premier Circle level.

The restrooms located in this lounge are for use by Patron program members only.

#### Mezzanine



There are 37 steps up from the interior lobby to the Mezzanine.

There is a coat room which contains free storage lockers for jackets and oversized items.

There's a water fountain in the coat room.

## The House is Open






The doors to the theatre will open approximately 30 minutes prior to curtain.

Please have your tickets out prior to entering the theatre.

Match the section, row, and seat number on your ticket to the signs outside each theatre door to determine your best point of entry.

## Please find your seat



There are steps in the Orchestra, Premier Circle, and Mezzanine.

If you are seated in rows AA through F on house left (ODD numbers) of the Orchestra and wish to avoid steps, please speak with the Theatre Manager about using the entrance without steps.

You will hear an announcement five minutes before the performance begins. At this time, please find your seat, turn off cellular phones, unwrap hard candies, and settle in for the show.

#### **Assistive Listening Devices**

- If you use hearing aids and decide NOT to use our t-coil loop, please remove the hearing aid and turn it off to avoid noisy feedback.
- If you do not know how to turn off your hearing aids, you can safely leave them with the Front of House staff when you check out one of our assistive listening devices.
- Please confirm the number of the device is facing you and the letters are facing the stage.
  - Be sure the device is not covered by any jewelry or item of clothing. These will block the feed to your device.

## The Play is about to begin

The theatre's house lights will fade out and the stage will become brighter. There may be music or other sound effects.

If the play is performed with an intermission you'll have an opportunity to leave your seat to use the restroom or purchase refreshments.

If you need to leave the theatre during the performance, you may not be able to re-enter the theatre, but you can watch the performance on the screen in the lower level Solomon Lounge.
